

## Total Mobility changes until 30 June 2020

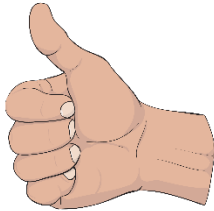


Total Mobility Cards are cards for disabled people who find it hard to travel on public transport.



If you have a Total Mobility card this means you will pay less for some kinds of travel.

# What has changed?

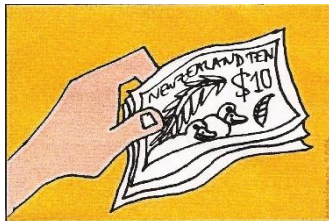


Your travel will now be free if the amount your trip would normally cost is less than the **regional limit**.



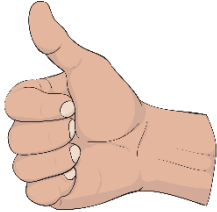
The **regional limit** is an amount of money.

The regional limit is different in different parts of New Zealand.

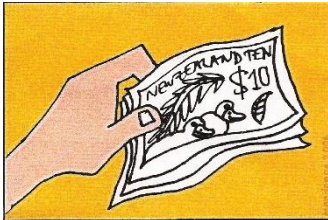


You will still have to pay some money if you take a trip that costs more than the **regional limit**.

## What has not changed?



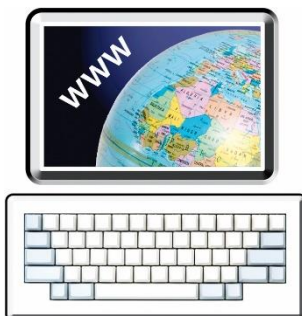
You will still need to use your Total Mobility card the same way you normally do.



You will only have to pay more money if you take a trip that costs more than the **regional limit**.



You can travel for any reason that you need to.

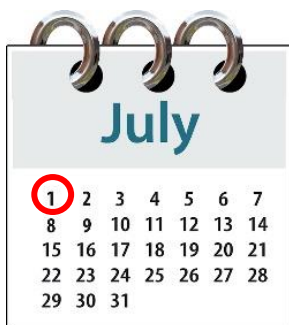

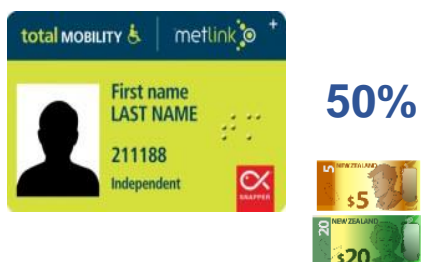
## How long are these changes for?



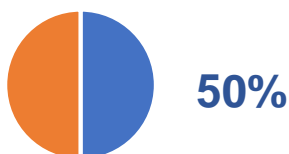
These changes are from now until 30 June 2020.



On **1 July 2020** the rules for your Total Mobility card will change again.



From **1 July 2020** your Total Mobility card will go back to giving you a **50 percent discount** on the cost of your trip up to the **regional limit**.



50 percent is **half** of the cost of your trip.
